From our Lay Director . . .

The Beauty of the Mass

I have been thinking about the Catholic Mass lately, after speaking to a woman who made the comment to me that “the Mass is the same every week”. Her attitude was that there is little prayer going on during our Mass.

The question I find myself asking “is the Mass the same every week?” I too, used to think so, back in the days when I was looking for a reason to leave the Catholic Church. Perhaps it is because I came so close to leaving our Catholic Church, that I now see a beauty to the Mass I came so close to losing as part of my prayer life.

The Celebration of the Mass is just that, a celebration. It is a time to worship and praise and give thanks to God for all that He has done for us.

The Eucharist is the center of our Mass. I think about how wonderful an idea it is. We use every one of our senses when we receive our Lord. Jesus designed the Sacrament in such a way that we need to come together to receive Him. Thinking about how much He loves us and wants us to be connected to Him, as well as being connected to one another, amazes me.

I am amazed at how much of our Mass is based on scripture and how truly beautiful the words are. Sometimes when I am reading a section of the Bible that is new to me and I recognize the verse, I realize that it is part of our Mass, either in the prayers or in the hymns.

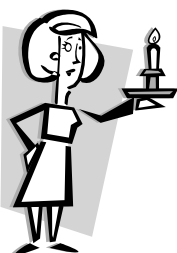
Going to Mass, even when one does not feel like it, helps us to continue to learn that obedience is a way to grow closer to God. When we do go to Mass, willing to give all of ourselves to God, including our weaknesses and strengths, the Mass becomes one of the deepest forms of prayer.

I think about tradition versus rituals. Each New Year, as I put our Christmas decorations away, I smile remembering some of our moments together from Christmas. Traditions help us to feel connected and bring us together more closely as a family. During Mass I used to see mindless rituals, now I see a rich tradition. Catholics can go to almost any Church and feel some sense of connection if they are going to the Mass with an open mind and the desire to pray.

Also, we have the power of the Holy Spirit during the Mass. More times than I can count, parts of the Mass came alive to me in a new way. This happens when I come to Mass with an open heart willing to receive whatever God wants to give me.

I found that the Catholic Mass is not the same every week. I have found that when I come to our Catholic Mass expecting to meet our Lord, I do find Him, in this most beautiful form of prayer.

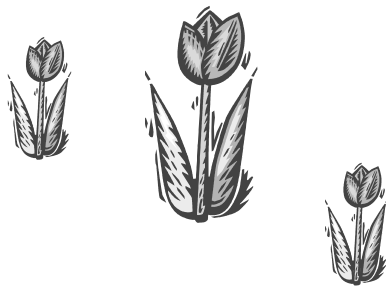
